



UN Triangular Partnership Programme (TPP)

Strengthening global peace operations through practical training, innovation, and cross-national cooperation.



What is TPP?

TPP is a United Nations initiative that builds the operational capacity of uniformed peacekeepers and African Union personnel in four critical areas: **engineering, medical, and C4ISR, and telemedicine**.

By connecting **troop-contributing countries**, **supporting Member States**, **and the UN Secretariat**, TPP enables faster, safer, and more capable peace operations.

Enhances safety, medical response, and tech readiness.



Our Areas of Work







TPP Pillar Highlights



- 1,205 trained personnel since 2015 across 3 continents.
- · Courses hosted in Kenya, Morocco, Rwanda, Uganda, Cambodia, Indonesia, Viet Nam, and Brazil.
- TOTs and equipment-sharing to build local capacity.



MEDICAL

- 327 peacekeepers trained in Field Medical Assistants Courses (FMAC).
- Modular TOT enabling TCCs to run their own courses.

- 29,000+ personnel trained from 152 countries.
- M-UAS operator and Women's Outreach Courses rolled out globally.
