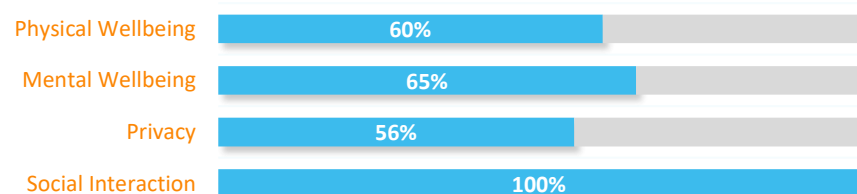

MINUSMA has implemented a Pilot Project in the existing GUIBATT camp, in Kidal. The living accommodation cluster was designed for 56 Guinea Battalion (GUIBATT) women. The pilot project consisted of constructing new facilities as per the [Elsie Initiative for Field Missions design-related recommendations](#). The major components of the implemented cluster are living accommodations, bathroom capsules attached to shared ablutions a masonry kitchen, a gazebo, a laundry and a bunker.

PROJECT'S HIGHLIGHTS AND DELIVERABLES

44 (65%) of applicable recommendations were implemented for the project.

Implemented improvements

Living accommodations	✓	New prefabricated structures. UN minimum scales.
Ablutions	✓	1/4 improved scale. Attached new ablation capsules.
Kitchen/Shared cooking spaces	✓	New masonry shared cooking space, inside the cluster.
Recreational spaces	✓	New masonry multi-function recreational space.
Other structures	✓	New masonry shared laundry space. Raised pathways.
Camp layout	✓	Cluster approach. Outdoor common space provided.
